It's possible that instead of PCOS specifically, the target population may be expanded so as to include other chronic disorders characterized by insulin resistance and inflammation. Students will have an active role in all aspects of conducting this study.

• Teaching Responsible Behaviors to Adolescents Program (TRBA). This has been an ongoing program for adolescents at risk (ages 12-18) housed at the Goodman Center. The program has been in existence since 2003. We have presented posters at APA's Divisions 37, Child and Family Policy and Practice, and 43, Family Psychology. It was also presented in an APA symposium in 2009, and its conceptual model at the Chicago School of Professional Psychology, at their 2008 Cultural Impact Conference. I am re-grouping students to start offering the treatment again in the Fall 2015. We are planning to send a manuscript with outcome data this year to the Journal of the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry.

Ongoing Research Studies:

- a. <u>Doors in the Unconscious:</u> This is a new method for brief trauma resolution useful for treating adults experiencing depression, anxiety, phobias, and post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). The freedom of choice is the cornerstone of this modality as it is derived from a Humanistic-Existential frame of reference. It is based on the notion that the mind has the ability to establish (or re-establish) an adaptive balance through self-regulatory processes that do not require an invasive course of action. - b. <u>The work drawing Test:</u> The purpose of this study was to develop, codify and validate a drawing test that will capture the perception and feelings that individuals have about their work environment and reveals information about the dynamics between the employee, peer, and supervisor.
